DEFECT CHECKLIST

This checklist should be used to identify any defects so you can report them to the relevant persons who can then take the appropriate action to ensure that the vehicle is brought back to a roadworthy condition for use on the public road.

- [] Driver's seat (& belt)
- [] Cab warning devices
- [] Horn & other warnings
- [] Driving controls/steering
- [] Brakes
- [] Direction indicators
- [] Odomoter or speedometer
- [] Windscreen wipers and washers
- [] Body interior (seating, lighting, & ventilation)
- [] First aid kit & fire extinguisher
- []Doors
- [] Number plates

- [] Mirrors
- [] Body exterior, access doors & compartments
- [] Exterior lights
- [] Discs
- [] Glass
- [] Spare wheel & jack
- [] Wheels & fixings

Minor defects are those which would not cause a danger if the vehicle was used on the public road but should be rectified as soon as possible. These include a small crack in the windscreen that does not obstruct the drivers view.

Serious defects are those that would cause a danger if the vehicle was used on the public road. These include: inoperative headlights, worn tyres and faulty brakes.

If your vehicle has a serious defect, you should not begin your journey.
